Wine Tasting

On a beautiful afternoon and early evening on October 2, Danubia hosted its 7th Annual Wine Tasting event. This event has become a perennial favorite with attendees as evidenced by the many who return year after year. The tasting was held outside in the picnic area under the tent where the venue was transformed by Fred Gauss into a setting with grape vines and a beautiful arrangement of plants and flowers.

Victor Ykoruk of Commonwealth Selections was once again our host and expert. He selected multiple wines from Allegro Winery to pair with our food selections for the evening. At the start of each of our five courses, he described the wine which was being served and gave insights into the varietal as well as other information about wine. He certainly made the evening informative and fun.

The first course of the evening was a Pork Tostada which consisted of shredded pork, beet slaw, cotija cheese, avocado crema, and bean spread on a tortilla crisp, paired with Allegro Winery's 2019 Dry Rose. Next served was Corn Zucchini Soup paired with a 2020 Sauvignon Blanc. The third course was a Citrus Quinoa Salad paired with a 2020 Steel Chardonnay. Fourth was a Stuffed Taco Boat with beef, black beans, salsa, and cheese in a boat shaped tortilla served with a corn muffin and paired with a 2019 Petite Sirah. The final course was a homemade decadent 70% cacao dark chocolate brownie with raspberry drizzle paired with Allegro's 2019 Petite Verdot.

Our guests certainly seemed to enjoy the food and wine but were also entertained by some games with wine prizes awarded to the winners. We played a wine trivia game where guests had to hold up cards indicating whether they believed the correct answer was over or under the number given until the last person was left standing. There was also a competition involving throwing wine corks into cups.

Many thanks to all who made the evening a success. First and foremost, thanks to our guests

and we hope you had a wonderful evening. Thank you to the planners, decorators, center piece makers, raffle basket makers, pourers, servers, kitchen help, and sound engineer whose efforts made the event possible. Lastly, we couldn't put on such a lovely evening without Victor Ykoruk and we thank him for helping make this a terrific event each year. We also wish Victor much success in the new Pinnacle Ridge Tasting Room that he has just opened at 34 Susquehanna Avenue in Lansdale. Be sure to stop in and visit him.

Recipe Corner

Corn Zucchini Soup

Ingredients:

- 1 Tbsp butter
- 2 strips bacon, chopped
- 1 chopped yellow onion
- 2 celery ribs, chopped
- 1 medium carrot, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- ½ tsp thyme
- 2 medium peeled russet potatoes, chopped into small cubes
- 4 cups chicken stock

(cont.)

- 1 bay leaf
- 4 ears of corn, husked and kernels placed in a bowl
- 1 medium zucchini, diced into cubes
- 1 cup cream or half and half
- Salt and black pepper to taste
- Cayenne pepper and chopped parsley to garnish

Directions:

1. In a large pot on medium heat, melt the butter. Add bacon and cook until bacon starts to brown.
2. Add onion, celery, carrots, garlic, and thyme; cook until veggies begin to soften, stirring occasionally.
3. Raise the heat to medium high and add in the potatoes, water, and bay leaf. Bring to a boil and then lower the heat to medium and simmer for 8-10 minutes.
4. Add zucchini and corn; season with salt and pepper to taste, and simmer for additional 8-12 minutes or until the vegetables are completely tender.
5. Fish out the bay leaf and then transfer 2 cups of soup to a food processor or blender. Blend until smooth. Stir the mixture back into the pot. Add half and half and cook just until heated through. Taste for salt and pepper.
6. Serve garnished with fresh chopped parsley and sprinkle of cayenne pepper, optional.

In Memoriam: Erich and Oskar Pohl

The club has lost two great men. Erich and Oskar Pohl passed away within one week of each other in January 2022. In life, they were always together, and so it is with their departure from this world. Both have been connected to the Danubia soccer program from the very beginning. They were the last two remaining men from the original board members of the Danubia soccer program which was started in the 1960s. They were born in Kalynivka, Ukraine, so they weren't from the traditional Donauschwaben area by birth, but they were Donauschwaben by every other measure. They coached youth teams and they played on the men's team.

They helped build the first of many Danubia soccer fields starting first at the Bavarian Club. They then built the one at the current club. Let's not forget that they cleared, lined, and maintained the field at the state hospital behind Somerton. They poured foundation cement for the current club in addition to pouring financial support when the club was purchased in the 1970s. They attended every soccer game even if it meant traveling to the indoor arena at 46th and Market Streets or to the Landes Fussball Turnier in Milwaukee. I'm sure Roni and Liesel, their wives, will attest to that.

Roni and Liesel never had to worry about where their husbands were on a Sunday afternoon at 2:30. Oskar and Erich supported Danubia teams for many years, and all the players appreciated the many pitchers of refreshments given to them after games. No wonder retired players always ask "how are Oskar and Erich?" The Pohl brothers were devoted members but mostly they were friends to us all. They spent many hours enjoying the soccer stories at the bar, but eventually they would erupt in chorus to sing "Fussball du allein, du allein sollst meine Freude sein." They shall be remembered as good men, good friends, good teammates, and good Donauschwaben.

In Memoriam: Katharina Marx

It is with deep sadness that I write the following.

With the recent passing of Katharina Marx (93), the Donauschwaben have lost one its most faithful members. She was heavily involved with the club since the 1960s, and she was still willing to help before her medical problems became too great in June.

She faithfully committed her time and effort for the past 35 years coordinating an annual Pilgrimage Mass at religious shrines to remember those who died in the various camps in Yugoslavia at the hands of the communists. Her thoughtful dedication to this event stems from her own survival as well as the loss of many of her own family members in these camps. She has always inspired a reverent and relevant celebration of Mass, making sure there was a German-speaking priest and the music of the Schubert Mass. It was always a beautiful and poignant event. Due to her efforts, she was able to arrange to have a Philadelphia cardinal and a Philadelphia archbishop celebrate this Mass held in German. She also successfully arranged to have Erzbischof Dr. Robert Zollitsch, Freiburg i.B., travel to Philadelphia and celebrate this Mass. Erzbischof Zollitsch is also a camp survivor born in Filipowa, Batschka.

In keeping with her religious efforts, Mrs. Marx was responsible for the annual support of the Deutsche in Romaenien Fund. Over the past 30 years, through her fundraising efforts, she has been

able to send over \$22,000 to needy individuals in the former homeland.

She served in many capacities for the association. Most notably, she was the secretary for many years. She was affectionately known as the club historian. The five presidents under whom she served would attest to her efficiency and meticulous recordkeeping (both in English and German).

As a result of the above works, she was awarded the National Donauschwaben Cultural Award in 2015 for her dedication to the Donauschwaben culture.

She was also an artist. She had stationary made from some of her paintings and donated it to the National Donauschwaben Foundation as a fundraiser. She also donated paintings for the club's various raffles.

She was the subject of the book "Last Waltz on the Danube" by Ali Botein-Furrevig published in 2012. It was a very impactful historical account of her family history, as well as the Donauschwaben, and the atrocities they survived.

She had a rigorous work ethic, and when it came to details, nothing was left to chance. Here are two stories.

- I always admired her rose collection. She had a wonderful collection of rose bushes which were constantly cut to decorate the club for events. Pictures of her garden regularly appeared in the club's newsletter. She said that she would give me a few cuttings to grow. At the time I didn't know you could do this. Well, the next day she was standing at my door with 10 cuttings tied with a colored ribbon to indicate the color, a bag full of horse manure, which according to her is absolutely necessary for success, and a sketched layout of the Northeast horse farm where I can get the free manure. A majority of the roses are still thriving in my garden.
- The City of Philadelphia sent the association a delinquency notice that we did not have a valid business license. It is

a one-time payment. Frau Marx put the city in their place by producing a 20-year-old receipt and license from her records. The inspector said he had never seen such a version of a license or receipt.

There was a generational difference between us. In conversations or discussions, it was never Käthe or Katharina, it was always "Frau Marx." For those who grew up in the club, we know that is the only and proper way. Though there was an age and cultural difference, Frau Marx and I became friends and shared many conversations.

She was a good friend and a wonderful role model. She will be missed.


